Predictive Services Discussion:

Well above normal, record-setting temperatures will continue in the Southwest and southern California, although temperatures will be slightly cooler than the past few days. Well above normal temperatures will also continue throughout the northern Intermountain West and much of the Plains, as well. Minimum relative humidity will be 4-20% for much of the West, with minima of 15-30% on the Plains into the Mississippi Valley, Appalachians, and Great Lakes. A few showers will move into western Washington, while very isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms develop in central and northeast Nevada into much of Utah, with a few ignitions possible. Gusty southwest winds of 10-20 mph will develop along the Sierra Front into south-central Oregon, while downslope westerly winds gusting to 40 mph develop in central Montana.

Northerly sustained winds of 12-20 mph with gusts near 25 mph are forecast in East Texas into the Lower Mississippi Valley amid relative humidity in the teens creating elevated fire weather conditions. Drier conditions are expected along the East Coast, but heavy rain will continue across the Florida Peninsula ahead of Hurricane Milton.
