Table Rock Complex (2 fires), South Carolina Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 2). Four miles northeast of Sunset, SC. Timber, hardwood litter and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and isolated torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Black Cove, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (NC State Team 1). IMT is also managing the Deep Woods and Fish Hook fires. Five miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, light slash and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Deep Woods, North Carolina Forest Service. Four miles northeast of Saluda, NC. Hardwood litter, timber and light slash. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and spotting. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Fish Hook, North Carolina Forest Service. Five miles north of Columbus, NC. Hardwood litter, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Alarka #5, North Carolina Forest Service. Five miles south of Bryson City, NC. Hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running. Residences threatened.

Big Ridge, Chattahoochee-Oconee NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). Eight miles northeast of Clayton, GA. Hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and flanking. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

* **Rattlesnake Branch**, North Carolina Forest Service. CIMT (SA Team 1) mobilizing. Eleven miles southeast of Waynesville, NC. Hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running. Numerous residences threatened.

* **CR832**, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles southeast of Port LaBelle, FL. Timber and southern rough. Active fire behavior with creeping.

* **East River Mountain**, Virginia DOF. Two miles northwest of Rocky Gap, VA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with flanking. Residences threatened.

* **Happy Hill Road**, Oklahoma DOF. Eight miles southeast of McAlester, OK. Timber and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

* **South Tiger**, Okmulgee Agency, BIA. Nine miles southeast of Henryetta, OK. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with torching, spotting and running.

Crusoe Island Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Twelve miles east of Williams, NC. Timber. Active fire behavior with creeping.

Red Hill, Okmulgee Agency, BIA. Three miles southeast of Salem, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and backing. Structures threatened.

* **Nickel**, Okmulgee Agency, BIA. Three miles northwest of Haydenville, OK. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened.

* **Campbell**, Tennessee DOF. Two miles north of Jacksboro, TN. Timber. Active fire behavior.

Walnut, Oklahoma DOF. Five miles north of Boley, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and creeping. Structures threatened.

Fisherman's Corner, Oklahoma DOF. Seven miles northeast of Stigler, OK. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

344, Florida Forest Service. Seven miles east of Florida City, FL. Grass. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Lost John, Osage Agency, BIA. Six miles east of Hominy, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. No new information.

Cumulative acres showing in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy and dry southwesterly winds of 10-20 mph gusting to 30 mph amid relative humidity of 15-30% will develop on the eastern slopes of the southern Appalachians to the Piedmont tomorrow, while dry conditions continue across the rest of the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic. Easterly winds are expected to increase across Florida to 15-20 mph tomorrow, as well. Breezy south to southwest winds are also likely to continue on the Plains into the Mid-Mississippi Valley, but minimum relative humidity is likely to remain above 20%, except across eastern Colorado where 7-15% is forecast. Farther west, breezy westerly winds are forecast across the Southwest where temperatures will remain above normal, and minimum relative humidity will fall to 5-20%. The lowest humidity is expected across southeast Arizona into southern and eastern New Mexico where elevated to locally critical conditions are forecast. In the rest of the West, breezy southwest winds will continue in the Great Basin, but temperatures will be cooler along with increased humidity. Precipitation will continue in northern California and the Northwest, mainly west of the Cascades, with light precipitation into the northern Rockies. Mainly dry conditions are expected in Alaska except for isolated snow showers in far western Alaska, while light to moderate trade winds continue in Hawai'i with isolated windward showers.
